

# Sample Coast Guard Warrant Officer Exhibit

**ID Number.** A nine- or ten-character code assigned by ACE to identify each exhibit. The first three characters for warrant officers are "CGW."

**Title.** The official Coast Guard title during the period of the exhibit dates.

**Exhibit Dates.** Start and end dates by month and year. An end date of "Present" indicates that the exhibit is current. "Pending Evaluation" means that an evaluation is scheduled.

**Exhibit Dates:** 1/90-9/94.

## Career Pattern

May have progressed to Electronics Warrant Officer from Aviation Electronics Technician (AT), Electronics Technician (ET), Sonar Technician (ST), or Telephone Technician (TT).

**Career Pattern.** Shows the various possible career paths for the warrant officer. Titles and designators are provided.

**Description.** The skills, competencies, and knowledge required for proficiency in the officer specialty.

## Description

Serves as an officer technical specialist in the field of electronics; supervises and directs personnel in all aspects of electronic repair of equipment, operation of electronic repair facilities, and maintenance of operational equipment; plans and supervises instructional programs; handles personnel duties, budget matters, records, and requisition of supplies; serves as technical liaison with other services and commercial organizations; prepares technical and administrative reports.

**Team Review Date.** Date when the occupation was last evaluated by a team of faculty members drawn from academia. This information is particularly useful in subject areas where state-of-the-art is important in determining the applicability of credit. ACE's policy is that Team Reviews must occur at least every ten years.

**Recommendation.** Educational credit is expressed in semester hours and recommended in four categories: vocational certificate, lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree, upper-division baccalaureate, and graduate degree.

## Recommendation

In the lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree category, 3 semester hours in technical communications, 3 in personnel supervision, and 3 for field experience in electronics systems operations. In the upper-division baccalaureate category, 3 semester hours in principles of management, 3 in management problems, 3 in budget administration, and 3 for field experience in management (2/86) (2/86).

**Review Date.** Most recent date the occupation was reviewed, either by an academic team or in-house by ACE (in-house reviews are conducted when changes to occupation content are minor).
