ID Number. A ten-character code assigned by ACE to identify each MOS exhibit.

Title. The official Marine Corps title of the MOS during the period of the exhibit dates.

MOS Designation. The official Marine Corps system of identifying occupations and their levels.

Exhibit Dates: 4/87–1/98.

Exhibit Dates. Start and end dates by month and year. An end date of “Present” indicates that the MOS still exists. “Pending Evaluation” means that the MOS is scheduled to be evaluated.

Occupation Field. Number and title designating a group of related MOS's.

Occupational Field: 60 (Aircraft Maintenance).

Career Pattern

PVT: Private (E-1). **PFC:** Private First Class (E-2). **LCP:** Lance Corporal (E-3). **CPL:** Corporal (E-4). **SGT:** Sergeant (E-5). **SSGT:** Staff Sergeant (E-6). **GYSGT:** Gunnery Sergeant (E-7). NOTE: MOS duties are not defined in terms of rank or paygrade, but by levels. Level I identifies tasks that are taught in the classroom.... Level II identifies those tasks that are part of on-the-job training; the trainee can Level III indicates that the individual can perform all essential tasks without supervision. Level IV indicates a high level of proficiency in job performance; the individual can perform advanced...and supervision. The MOS designator 6081 (Aircraft Safety Equipment Mechanic—Trainee), is used to identify individuals in Levels I and II. Upon completion of Level II, MOS 6084 is awarded. Credit is recommended for Levels III and IV.

Career Pattern. Path of advancement. Indicates military rank and paygrade. Special note defines the levels which are the basis for the credit recommendations.

Description. A summary description applying to all levels, and a separate description of the skills, competencies, and knowledge required for proficiency in each level.

Description

Summary: Inspects and maintains aircraft safety equipment. **Levels I and II:** Performs, under close supervision and training, routine duties.... **Level III:** Able to perform the duties required for Levels I and II; tests aircraft for pressure tightness.... **Level IV:** Able to perform the duties required for Level III; plans, schedules, and directs work assignments....prepares and submits required reports and records.

MATMEP Statement. Guidance for determining the level of training achieved (applies only to Marine Core enlisted personnel in the aviation field at this time).

Recommendation

To determine the level of training completed (I-IV), service members must provide an official copy of their Individual Duty Area Qualification Summary extract from the MATMEP. The Qualification Summary indicates the level of training completed and the date of completion.

Team Review Date. Date when the skill level was last evaluated by a team of faculty members drawn from academia. This information is particularly useful in subject areas where state-of-the-art is important in determining the applicability of credit. ACE's policy is that Team Reviews must occur at least every ten years.

Recommendation. By level. Only the recommendation for the *highest* level held should be used; the recommendations should *not* be added. Educational credit is expressed in semester hours and recommended in four categories: vocational certificate, lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree, upper-division baccalaureate, and graduate degree.

Level III: In the lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree category, 3 semester hours in industrial safety (8/89) (8/89).

Level IV: In the lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree category, 3 semester hours in industrial safety.... In the upper-division baccalaureate category, 2 semester hours for field experience in management if rank was Staff Sergeant (SSGT), and 3 semester hours for field experience in management if rank was Gunnery Sergeant (GYSGT) (8/89) (8/89).

Review Date. Most recent date the skill level was reviewed, either by an academic team or in-house by ACE (in-house reviews are conducted when changes to skill level content are minor).
