

Sample Navy Warrant Officer/Limited Duty Officer Exhibit

ID Number. A ten-character code assigned by ACE to identify each exhibit. The first three digits for warrant officers are "NWO" and for limited duty officers are "LDO."

Exhibit Dates. Start and end dates by month and year. An end date of "Present" indicates that the exhibit is current. "Pending Evaluation" means that an evaluation is scheduled.

Description. The skills, competencies, and knowledge required for proficiency in the officer specialty.

Recommendation. Educational credit is expressed in semester hours and recommended in four categories: vocational certificate, lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree, upper-division baccalaureate, and graduate degree.

Career Pattern

May have progressed to Cryptologic Technician Warrant Officer from Cryptologic Technician, Administrative (CTA); Cryptologic Technician, Interpretive (CTI); Cryptologic Technician, Maintenance (CTM); Cryptologic Technician, Communications (CTO); Cryptologic Technician, Collection (CTR); or Cryptologic Technician, Technical (CTT).

Description

Serves as an officer technical specialist in all phases of operations conducted by the Naval Security Group Command, including signals intelligence, signals security, and electronic warfare; responsible for administration, personnel support, electronic maintenance, communications, and technical research in support of the operating forces and the national cryptologic effort; provides overall technical supervision, in accordance with appropriate directives required in employing equipment and manpower resources; supervises the installation and maintenance of electrical, electromechanical, and electronic equipment and the conduct of communications, administrative, or communications security functions; writes technical reports and personnel evaluation reports.

Recommendation

In the lower-division baccalaureate/associate degree category, 3 semester hours in technical communication and 3 in personnel supervision. In the upper-division baccalaureate category, 3 semester hours in principles of management, 3 in management problems, and 3 for field experience in management (2/86)(2/86).

Title. The official Navy title during the period of the exhibit dates.

Designation. The official Navy system of identifying warrant officers and limited duty officers. The fourth digit, X, may be a number from 0-9.

Career Pattern. Shows the various possible career paths for the warrant officer or LDO. Titles and designators are provided.

Team Review Date. Date when the occupation was last evaluated by a team of faculty members drawn from academia. This information is particularly useful in subject areas where state-of-the-art is important in determining the applicability of credit. ACE's policy is that Team Reviews must occur at least every ten years.

Review Date. Most recent date the occupation was reviewed, either by an academic team or in-house by ACE (in-house reviews are conducted when changes to occupation content are minor).
